Harbourside

Old City

Redcliffe and Temple

medieval landmarks such as St Mary Redcliffe Church and Temple Church. Discover fabulous restaurants, food markets, bars and pubs from Finzels Reach to Victoria Street, Temple Quay and beyond.

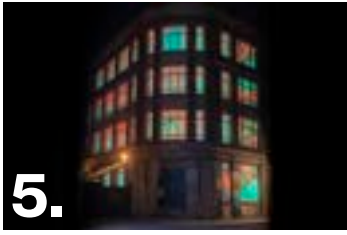
2. SIRENS

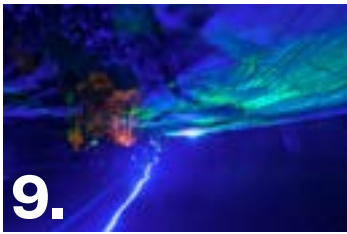
6. CHEERS DRIVE

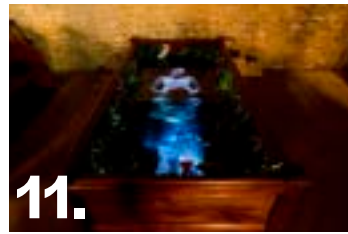
8. TRUMPET FLOWERS

 Located at Quakers Friars in Cabot Circus, 'Trumpet Flowers' will surprise and delight visitors who play together to make a spectacular floral symphony of sound and light. Catch one of the scheduled animated musical scores throughout the evening.



9. BEAM
 PYTCH
 A new artwork by Bristol-based creatives PYTCH. Lasers and haze illuminate Castle Bridge, creating a beautiful, ever-changing light sculpture for visitors to immerse themselves within.



10. CONTINUUM
 ILLUMAPHONIUM
 'Continuum' is a captivating maze of 25 mirrored monoliths, erected within the grounds of Temple Church. Walk between the pillars to activate sound and light, bathing in the historic reflections of this iconic Bristol venue.



11. OPHELIA
 STUDIO MCGUIRE
 Inside St Mary Redcliffe Church can be found a life-sized hologram of Shakespeare's Ophelia which references Millais' famous Pre-Raphaelite painting. A gentle, contemplative piece by Studio McGuire.
